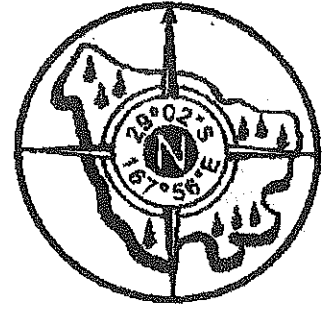

## Public Service Review

A requirement of the Norfolk Island Roadmap process is an independent review of the public service and government owned enterprises. Through the Commonwealth tender process the Australian Continuous Improvement Group (ACIG) has been selected to undertake that review.

"The team will be led by Peter Johnstone OAM, we are lucky to have him, with his previous senior level government experience including CEO of many public sector organisations and also his very practical experience. His senior level state government experience will be asset to this project." a Commonwealth spokesperson said.

The team will be on Norfolk Island, commencing interviews during the week of 18 July 2011. The team will interview a diverse range of interested stakeholders during this week and not only from the public sector. To enable community input a public meeting has been organised at Rawson Hall on Tuesday 19 July 2011 from 5.30pm to 6.30pm. The meeting will be attended by members of the ACIG Team who will be able to answer any questions and receive comments and views from the community.
